RECTOR'S RAMBLINGS

You may remember me writing in one of my magazine letters last year about how at the same time that I was writing the letter I was also preparing for my mother's funeral service. I said how death is very much part of my work and how I always think what a privilege it is to share in the journey of someone who is dying or to help in the process of saying goodbye by leading a funeral service. It is the essence of why I went into the ministry, part of the sharing of the journey of life.

As I write this month's letter I am preparing for another funeral. As a result of me writing that letter last year, someone wrote to me, asking if I would visit her husband who had been diagnosed with terminal cancer. One visit led to regular visits and while we talked about things like family and work we also talked about death and how he wanted his funeral to be. We spoke about the music and the readings and how and where it would happen. Above all he told me, "I would like the service to be all about love. There is not enough love in the world but I have always tried to show love to everybody I have met."

The music he chose for the start of the service was 'The Prayer', sung by Andrea Bocelli and Celine Dion. It wasn't a song that I remembered hearing before, but it's sung beautifully by both of them in a combination of English and Italian. To have some Italian in the service seems entirely appropriate because Italian is, after all, traditionally known as 'the language of love', not least because with so many words ending in vowels it sounds more like singing than speaking. So, if you listen to 'The Prayer' you'll hear Andrea Bocelli sing these words:

*La luce che tu dai
Nel cuore restera
A ricordarci che
L'eterna stella sei*

All this reminds me of a scene from the film 'The Shawshank Redemption' in which one of the prisoners plays a recording of Mozart's 'Marriage of Figaro' over the prison tannoy system. Listening in the prison yard one of the prisoners, played by Morgan Freeman, says:

"I have no idea to this day what those two Italian ladies were singing about. Truth is, I don't want to know. Some things are best left unsaid. I'd like to think they were singing about something so beautiful, it can't be expressed in words, and makes your heart ache because of it. I tell you, those voices soared higher and farther than anybody in a grey place dares to dream."

Some things simply can't be summed up or expressed in words, and love, like God – for God is love – is one of them. Nevertheless, I'd like to leave the words of 'The Prayer' with you. As I write, the funeral hasn't happened but when you read this it will have taken place and I have no doubt that the music chosen and played at the service will have taken all of us present to a place where our hearts ache and yet we dare to dream. So, having translated the words above and adding the words of English that follow them, here is 'The Prayer' for you:

*The light that you give
In the heart will remain
To remind us that
When stars go out each night
You are the eternal star.*

*Let this be our prayer
When shadows fill our day
Lead us to a place
Guide us with your grace
Give us faith so we'll be safe*

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

The **Burstow Council Annual Parish Meeting**, which is a chance for residents of the Parish to come and see what the Council is up to, takes place this year in Centenary Hall on **Monday 16 April at 7.30 pm**.

At last the much reported building alterations to Centenary Hall are to commence shortly after Easter and will progress in stages until mid September. We apologise for the temporary loss of three much valued parking spaces for the duration of the work. The alterations will provide a complete change for the pre-school which will have its own toilet facilities, tea point and storage area with child and parental access only from the south end of the building. A new main kitchen will be formed and the existing kitchen area and the Outwood Room will be merged into one area with a soundproof dividing partition to provide two public use areas, one of which will hopefully provide for Community 'meet and greet' facilities. The Parish Clerk's office will be enlarged and additional general storage facilities will be provided at the south end of the Main Hall

The Parish Council is now well into the new year with one new piece of legislation this May directly affecting us. The General Data Protection Regulations come in to force, giving far more protection to individuals, especially relating to how your personal information is collected and stored. This will mean a good deal of extra work to ensure we are fully compliant. We will have to appoint an external Data Protection Officer, and as the various elements are completed we will update our policies and information on the parish website. One way this will directly affect residents is that we will now need to ask you for your permission to receive updates, emails and other electronic info at regular intervals. To ensure you don't unwittingly miss out, please respond when we ask for your consent.

Our Flood Action Group, working with others, was hoping for a multi-agency meeting at the end of February but this was called off due to the snow! They are hoping to rebook at a time when all the relevant agencies can be gathered together. Surrey C.C., Tandridge D.C., Environmental Agency, Thames Water, Surrey Highways, Highways for England and Reigate and Banstead Council will be asked about outstanding issues regarding sewage problems, blocked culverts, drains, gullies and ditches, the Smallfield flood alleviation scheme, pumping stations and much more! Once this meeting has been held we will keep you updated via the Flood Action Group page on the parish website.

Our Community Speedwatch Team has been active on roads in and around the village. The number of vehicles exceeding the 30mph speed limit is statistically

reducing since this has been operating. The team is made up entirely from volunteers working with Surrey Police to make our roads safer.

Neighbourhood Watch has received reports of eight burglaries over the past couple of days. Homes, sheds, outbuildings and farm locations are being targeted around our area, and police are asking that anyone suspecting a problem should dial 101. We are seeking replacement co-ordinators for Broadbridge Lane, Churchill Road, Wheelers Lane and Hayes Walk. If you can help please get in touch at smallfieldnw@gmail.com

Our Neighbourhood Plan Group is working hard to research the current state of the parish. When this is complete the information will be analysed to determine the needs (as opposed to wants) in the parish to make it healthy and sustainable for the next 15 years. This is a long and arduous undertaking and we need more volunteer help to spread the load. This is a very important local imperative to work alongside the Tandridge Plan, so please see if you can help.

Our plans for extra car parking in the village have been submitted to Tandridge, so hopefully this will come to fruition in the near future.

Busy, busy times – just hope that the Snow Angels are not called out until at least December!!

BURSTOW AND SMALLFIELD WOMEN'S INSTITUTE

After singing Jerusalem and listening to the President's announcements the members of Burstow and Smallfield WI settled down to hear a talk given by Sally Nilsson entitled 'The man who sank the Titanic – the story of my Great Grandfather'. Sally has written a book about her Great Grandfather's life and has been involved in television broadcasts, particularly around the centenary of the sinking of the Titanic.



Sally's Great Grandfather, Robert Hitchens, was born in 1882 in Newlyn, Cornwall, the eldest of ten children to a Primitive Methodist family. Newlyn at the time was a major fishing port – the catches mostly of pilchards and mackerel – and although Robert had the sea in his blood he aspired to greater things and by the age of 18 he had enrolled in the Royal Naval Reserves working his way up to the rank of Quarter Master. Robert knew that the future lay with steam ships and in 1906 he moved to Southampton and set up home with his new wife. They must have been a curious pair to passers-by as Robert was stocky and only 5 ft 6 inches tall and his wife was a willowy 6 footer. Initially Robert was involved in the movement of troops but with the arrival of the White Star Line ship the Titanic from Belfast on 6 April 1912 he was the first Quarter Master to sign on the crew and became one of the six Quarter Masters on the new luxury liner. At midday on 10 April 1912 the 46,000 ton Titanic was pulled out of harbour by a tug and set sail for Cherbourg to pick up more passengers – it was too big to enter the harbour so the passengers were ferried out by smaller boats – and then on to Queenstown, Ireland for more passengers – mostly 3rd class going to America for a better life – and also the post. The Titanic now had its full compliment of 2,200 passengers and crew and it set off across the Atlantic bound for New York at an average speed of 22 knots.

On the night of Sunday 14 April 1912 Robert was in the wheelhouse in charge of steering the Titanic. That winter had been unusually warm and large numbers of icebergs had calved from the glaciers and the sea was full of floating ice. Messages from other ships were not getting through to the Titanic due to the passengers constantly sending their own messages to friends and relations. To compound this problem Reginald Lee, who was stationed in the crow's nest with a colleague, had no binoculars so was spotting by eyesight alone.

At 11.10 Robert at the helm heard a bell from the crow's nest and then at 11.40 another bell sounded outside the wheelhouse and the 1st officer Murdoch on the bridge – which was not part of the wheelhouse – shouted 'hard starboard' and then 'hard port' – but as we know the inevitable happened and Titanic sustained a 300ft gash to the hull. Captain Smith ordered a damage report which took 45 minutes to complete – and then ordered abandon ship. There were only life boats for 1,000 people so tragedy was sure to ensue. Robert was to take his designated lifeboat (number 6) with passengers and to row towards the steamer California which was reportedly 5 miles

away. In the end only 22 people boarded his lifeboat and they rowed for 2 miles and then turned to watch the awful sight of the Titanic upending and sinking.

One of the passengers on Robert's life boat was the wife of a rich silver mine owner – her name was Molly Brown – later named 'The Unsinkable Molly Brown' and she demanded that Robert turn back their lifeboat to rescue survivors in the sea – but Robert had been given specific orders to stay away. Eventually the Carpathia arrived and those still alive were rescued and taken to New York where the passengers were feted and the surviving crew were treated appallingly – and in the subsequent enquiry into the disaster, Robert, despite giving his truthful testimony, was branded a coward and bully by none other than the 'Unsinkable Molly Brown'

On returning to Britain Robert did not retain his job despite all the officers keeping theirs. However he was sent to South Africa, only coming back at the beginning of the First World War. Having served in the war he then went back to Torquay and bought a small steamer called the Queen Mary to run pleasure cruises. To achieve this he took loans but in the 30's the lenders wanted their money back and Robert turned to drink. Robert wrote booklets about his experiences which he sold eventually amassing enough money to purchase a silver revolver. He then took this revolver to kill one of the men to whom he owed money – his failed attempt led to him trying to kill himself and ultimately to his arrest. The judge took into account his previous experiences and commuted his death sentence and he served time in Parkhurst coming out again in 1937. He went on to serve in the Second World War, taking part in the Battle of the Atlantic but died in 1941 at the age of 59.

The members thoroughly enjoyed Sally's interesting and detailed talk. Tea was then served and the winner of the Easter Basket competition – which had 9 entries – was announced with the winner being our newest member, Maggie Robertson.

The next meeting on 10 April at 2.00 pm will be our 98th Birthday Party with celebration tea and a speaker from Kew Gardens.

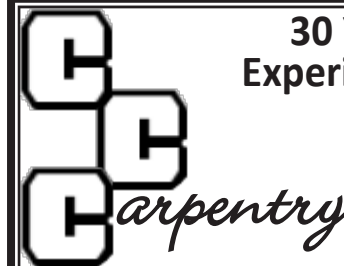

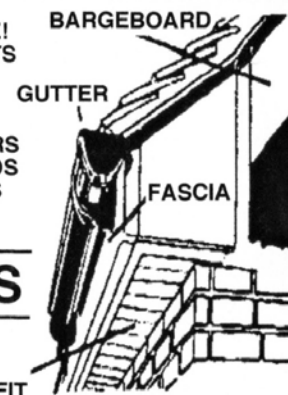
