### RECTOR'S RAMBLINGS

The month of June brings the longest day of the year, 21 June, the summer solstice. The word solstice comes from the Latin word solstitium, which literally means the sun standing still. From the point of view of an observer on earth, the summer solstice marks the most northerly point of the sun's annual journey through the sky, a time when the sun appears to stand still before retracing its journey in a southerly direction.

I've always been fascinated by the movements of the stars and the planets as well as the moon, both through the year and also on a daily basis. People have shared this fascination for thousands of years. The first day of the week, the day on which Christians worship is named after the sun – Sunday – and the first Christians adopted the general religious instinct of facing the place of sunrise when worshipping. The most important Sunday for Christians is Easter Sunday and Easter is named after the Anglo-Saxon word for dawn Eostre, from which we get our word East, as well as Easter.

After Easter the second most important day in the Christian calendar is Christmas Day. Nobody knows exactly when Jesus was born but the date of 25 December was

settled on by the Roman Emperor Constantine in the fourth century AD. It was chosen because it was the time when the Romans already celebrated the rebirth of the sun, the time around the winter solstice when the days stopped getting shorter and started to get longer, and therefore an appropriate day to celebrate the birth of Christ, the invincible sun of righteousness.

Once the birth of Christ had been set at the time of the winter solstice it became inevitable that the celebration of birth of St John the Baptist would be set at the time of the summer solstice, because, according to the Gospel of Luke, the birth of John took place six months before the birth of Christ and the longest day and the shortest day are six months apart.

In the early church the Birth of John the Baptist was the most important saint's day in the Christian calendar and a much-celebrated holy day (or holiday) in this country until the reformation. John was seen as the light that lit the way for Jesus, the light of the world, so the celebrations always involved firelight, particularly the light of the 'bone fire' (from which we get our word bonfire), which was made by burning animal bones. Its light and pungent smell was believed to ward off evil. Another type of fire was created by wrapping a cartwheel with straw, setting it alight and then rolling it down a hill – a dramatic representation of the sun's journey across the sky.

Sadly for me, a great fire lover, those celebrations are no longer associated with St John the Baptist's Day in this country. However, this year at St John the Baptist,

Outwood, we will be marking the day in a special way with a Heritage Day on 23 June, in celebration of all the restoration work being done on the church building. Do come along; further details can be found on page 13.

Signs of Summer at last! Firstly I should like to thank Ray Holdsworth who has stood down as Chair for all his hard work over the past few years. Ray remains as a member of the Parish Council and, as Vice Chair will continue his support for the forthcoming year.

Progress on the refurbishment of Centenary Hall continues at apace. The new store room is complete and we are anticipating that all new storage units will be in place very shortly. Lots of holes that were in the rear wall of the assembly hall have been filled in and equally lots of new holes have appeared. The outline of the new kitchen can be clearly seen and we now have natural light in that area from a roof light and glazing to the new external door (see pictures, below). Should all run to the planned programme, and it is at the moment, the new kitchen fit out will start during the week commencing 21 May and will be fully operational shortly after.

Our Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group has been put on hold for a couple of months pending a possible change in government legislation and anyone wishing to join this group should forward details to the Parish Clerk

According to national statistics we unfortunately appear to have dropped from the safest village in Tandridge to 4th. 518 crimes were committed in Smallfield, Burstow, Horne and Outwood between March 2017 and February 2018 with a peak in criminal activity in January 2018. 129 Antisocial behaviour, 100 criminal damage and arson, 119 violent and sexual offences and some drugs offences. Antisocial behaviour is still the main priority with our policing team.

One success story: youths in a car decided one dark night to ram it into a resident's field gate and set fire to the vehicle. They thought it even more fun to record the event on their mobile phones. Some weeks later a youth was apprehended with the assistance of a Police dog scaling a garden wall in Reigate. When the Police accessed is phone and the content discovered he was suitably dealt with.

Burstow Parish Council has added further cameras to the village CCTV system and have agreed to the purchase a further camera this year to cover the Broadbridge and Weatherhill Road junction. There are 274 'Watches' in Tandridge covering 9,702 homes. The Smallfield Watch has had some natural wastage of Coordinators and we require volunteers to replace coordinators for Broadbridge Lane, Churchill Road, Wheelers Lane, parts of the Cravens and Hayes Walk, not forgetting the roads as yet not covered by the original Watch scheme. We welcomed William Gardens to the team this year and they have set up a 'WhatsApp' group to communicate swiftly between their members. I fear there has been some complacency amongst residents now the catapult and vehicle damage of 2015/16 are behind us. We need to remain vigilant and report even the minor incidents to 101 or by email at peak times. 999 should always be used if the crime is in progress.

I regularly attend the Tandridge Neighbourhood Watch Steering Group meetings where we discuss Policing issues and crime prevention. A group of coordinators attended their Annual Seminar last July. We networked with 70 other 'watches' in Tandridge, Policing Teams and Commissioners from Surrey Police. The event was a resounding success and another is planned for this June. Burstow Parish Council has offered a grant of £100 to support the Steering Group in the purchase of Road Signs, Bike Marking and other events.

All residents, regardless of whether a watch covers their road, can register with 'In The Know' to receive regular bulletins from Surrey and Sussex Police. Registering your personal property and precious items with The National Property Register 'Immobilise' gives you a better chance of property being returned if recovered if stolen.

### **British Heart Foundation – London to Brighton Bike Ride**

Alex Curtis and Jack Stevens attended on behalf of the BHF.

As a bit of background, the bike ride has been taking place for 40 years, and in this time, this is the first occasion where they have been invited by a Parish Council to meet and discuss the impact the ride has on local residents and how these can be mitigated.

The BHF was founded in 1961 and currently donated £100m towards research in heart disease each year. The bike ride is 54 miles long and involves numerous road closures and southbound vehicular traffic orders.

Previous years have seen the number of participants rise to 32,000 but in 2015 the BHF brought the management of the race back 'in house' and the number of riders is limited to 16,000. Despite the reduction in numbers the amount raised has risen each year. In 2016 £2.7m was raised, this increased to £2.8m in 2017 and this years target is £3.1m.

A meeting took place between the BHF, County Councillor Lesley Steeds and the Parish Council in Dec 2017 and a number of mitigation ideas were discussed. The senior management team then agreed to proceed on the following:

- To permit a right exit on Rookery Hill into Chapel Road. Previously this has been a closed road from this point down to Keepers Corner
- Southbound traffic be permitted from Rookery Hill to Wheelers Lane
- Traffic permitted to exit right at Weatherhill Road and Wheelers Lane
- Traffic permitted to exit left at Plough Road
- Additional letters sent to residents (14,000) along the entire route giving details on how they can contact BHF and register their travel arrangements so marshals can be informed and assist. Last year 11 people used this arrangement.

Approximately 196 care homes have been directly contacted by the BHF to ensure they have up-to-date information.

There is a year-long rolling programme for the bike race, with preparations beginning immediately after the race for the following year. BHF intends to engage and consult with residents every year.

Questions from residents covered the following areas

- Why is the race always scheduled for Fathers Day? BHF responded that the Police want a continuous date year on year for ease of planning

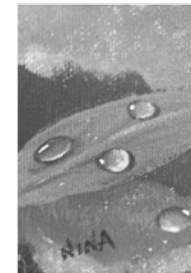
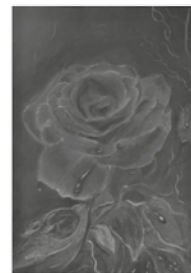

- All stewards and staff working on the ground will be issued with radios and are permitted to allow access/egress to the route when safe. *Continued on page xx*
- This year there will be six stewards stationed in the Smallfield area, an increase of four
- Following residents' comments the BHF representatives have agreed to ask senior management to investigate the feasibility of changing the date of the race.
- One resident suggested that it would be safer to use main roads such as the A23 for 16,000 cyclists. The BHF has approximately 400 St John Ambulance staff on duty, with ambulances stationed roughly every 5 miles along the route.
- A question was asked about how much of the money raised actually reached the intended purpose. BHF said that for every £1 raised 0.76p of this goes into research.

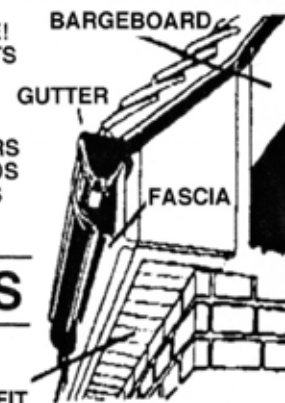
