## RECTOR'S RAMBLINGS

In July 2016 my daughter Rachel got married. In July 2017 my mother's funeral took place and in July 2018 my grandson's christening will take place. July is becoming a special month for me and my grandson's baptism will be a special occasion. My wife Judith reminded me recently that the first baptism that I ever did back in 1989 was my son Christopher's, nearly 30 years ago.

And writing that has just reminded me of another July date: I was ordained on 3 July 1988 so this month I will have been ordained 30 years, exactly half my life.

I trained for ordination in Durham and took up my first curacy in Forest Hill, South London. From there I moved to my first incumbency in Mottingham, a few miles down the road in SE9, and I was there for five years. After

Mottingham I was vicar of St John's, Redhill for 17 years before moving here at the end of 2014.

People often ask me why I became a vicar. I was preaching about that just the other day. It was in a sermon based on a passage in the Bible where the disciples want to find a replacement for Judas. Having prayed, they then cast lots and the lot fell on Matthias. I linked the casting of lots to the National Heritage Lottery grant for repairs that we have received for St John the Baptist, Outwood, and how the leaflets and publicity material we produce in relation to that have to have the crossed fingers of the National Lottery symbol on them. In effect, I said, they held a lottery and Matthias got the winning numbers.

The casting of lots is used quite a bit in the Bible to choose people, assign priestly duties, share land and settle disputes. We might find that a bit strange these days and if I answered the question asking why I got ordained by saying that my numbers came up people might think that was a bit of an odd reply. And yet it's true for me. Not in the sense that I won a lottery, but in the sense that I do just know that being what I am is my lot in life.

When people ask me about why I became a vicar I often say that my father was one too. And I often used to feel I should try and explain that that wasn't the real reason I became a vicar, as if it somehow didn't seem to answer the question fully enough. I don't feel the need to do that any more. I just feel I'm doing what I'm meant to be doing and I don't mean 'meant' in a particular way, religious or otherwise.

The spiritual teacher and author Eckhart Tolle wrote a book called A New Earth, in which he says:

*There are three words that convey the secret of the art of living, the secret of all success and happiness: One With Life. Being one with life is being one with Now. You then realise that you don't live your life, but life lives you. Life is the dancer, and you are the dance.*

'One with life'. I would say that when you are one with life, you are one with God.

People hope that crossing their fingers will bring them luck – 'fingers crossed!' And it may well be that 'fingers crossed' originally had a religious meaning and origin – making the sign of the cross with one's fingers. So I won't wish you luck but cross your fingers if you like, not for luck, but as a prayer to remind you that you are one with God.

## MEET OUR TWO LOCAL

### POLICE COMMUNITY SUPPORT OFFICERS

PCSO Conrad Cheeseman and PCSO Stuart Wren are the Police Community Support Officers who cover Burstow and Smallfield.

Stuart joined Surrey Police in 2008, working with traffic issues and on motorways, dealing with collisions, and joined the South Tandridge community team in 2014. Conrad, meanwhile, had become a PCSO in 2006, working for over seven years in Godstone and Blindley Heath before he also moved to cover Burstow and Smallfield.

The role of the PCSO, says Conrad, is to be the main eyes and ears around the community, representing the police in a neighbourhood. However, this is a very different role from that of PC Paul Baker who was previously known to many as the local Neighbourhood Specialist Officer who regularly walked around the village. In April 2016 'Policing in your Neighbourhood' was introduced and numbers of Safer Neighbourhood NSOs and PCSOs were reduced and the roles changed. Their work is now focused on chronic and repeat issues that present the greatest threat to harm and risk to communities. In addition to this PCSOs support the Area Patrol Teams, who are locally based and respond to and investigate local offences. This does mean that issues such as parking are not always a Policing matter and are likely to be better suited to other agencies such as the Local Authority.

#### **Reassurance and intelligence gathering**

The area covered by Conrad and Stuart is in fact much wider than Burstow and Smallfield. They also patrol Horne, Outwood, Lingfield, Dormansland, Felcourt, Felbridge, Copthorne and Blindley Heath. With that in mind it may not be surprising that their presence is slightly reduced from a few years ago. They both still see their role as one of reassurance and intelligence gathering but are realistic about the constraints of working in such a large area.

However, they say that it is not a bad thing if they are not seen as much – their absence should be reassuring. Their work is always focused on the areas where they are needed the most and round here at the moment there are very few live issues that need their time. Two years ago, they say, there were more problems locally, so this is testament to the fact that crime has reduced. There has been a reduction in reported crime and anti-social behaviour locally and this is greatly helped by the introduction of CCTV cameras to the village – the best eyes in the area and, they believe, money extremely well spent.

The public perception of crime is high, say Conrad and Stuart, in part due to what we see on the television. However Tandridge has a very low crime rate and within Tandridge, Smallfield has a very low incident rate at present. Their advice

A time for Hellos and Goodbyes. 'Au revoir' to Peter Bond who has worked quietly and tirelessly both as a Parish and District Councillor for many years. We thank Peter for all his support which has been greatly appreciated. Hi and welcome to Kevin Bourne who was elected as our Ward District Councillor in May. We look forward to working with him and offer all our help and assistance.

Tandridge District is fairly unique as England's local council with the greatest allocation of Green Belt, over 90%. By the time this reaches publication Tandridge will have announced the conclusion of the preparation of their local plan and their 'Call for Sites' evaluation. Should the Planning Inspectorate accept Tandridge's lower proposal of 6,800 new houses over the next 20 years, approximately half of the government's requirement, Smallfield will be expected to accommodate roughly 300 additional dwellings, an increase of about 16% over our present housing.

This will require the release of three areas of our presently protected green belt, these being: SMA 008 – land off Plough Road between Kingsmead and the allotment gardens, known locally as the duck pond, and SMA 004 – land off Redehall Road (to the rear of the Preparatory school). These sites to go forward from 2023/2026. The third site is SMA 30 – land on Plough Road to the rear of the Plough public house as an extension to Meadowview, to go forward in 2025/2026 with flood alleviation funds being accrued from CIL grants from the two earlier developments. There are also allocations to two smaller developments of a total of 25 dwellings on two brown field sites.

Given the amount of land originally offered by local land owners, the impact on our village will be far less than may have been, however the eventual implosion of the increase in population and the probable impact of traffic increase from the South Godstone Garden Village plan will have severe impact on our already overstretched infrastructure which will have to be carefully and considerably addressed as we move forward and your Council will keep a watchful eye on all future proposals.

We are aware of the ongoing issues with waste water drainage, in particular on Plough Road and Wheelers Lane. Because there is a combined waste and storm water system in place, during periods of prolonged or heavy rain many residents are unable to use their bathroom or kitchen facilities for fear of flooding their homes. Some work has been carried out to clear the drains, ensuring they are operating at their optimum capacity. However, it is

## BURSTOW AND SMALLFIELD WOMEN'S INSTITUTE

After the singing of Jerusalem the members and guests of Burstow and Smallfield WI settled down to hear the announcements of recent activities by some of the members of the WI. In May the knitting competition was to knit a baby hat or bonnet for a premature infant – in fact 70 hats were knitted – the winner being Sue Gill. The hats were then donated to the Premature Baby Unit at East Surrey Hospital.

On 26 May the WI held a cake sale in aid of Chase – Shooting Star, the children's hospice based in Guildford. There was an amazing selection of cakes, large and small and at the end of the session £150 was raised for Chase. Burstow and Smallfield WI intend to run another cake stall in the autumn.

A sub-committee has been involved in the making of a pollinator to be displayed at Wisley Gardens as part of the celebration of Surrey WI's centenary. Our entry is a Hummingbird Hawk Moth – a moth which is seen more frequently now particularly in southern England. Constructed from chicken wire and nylon tights which have been painted with the markings of this large and unusual moth, it will be one of the 110 entries which will be installed at Wisley for two weeks at the end of June and beginning of July.

Our speaker for the afternoon was Roger Leonard who has had a 40-year career in the Ambulance Service but is now a volunteer speaker and fundraiser for Kent, Surrey and Sussex Air Ambulance.

The Kent, Surrey and Sussex Air Ambulance grew out of an air ambulance service started in Rochester in Kent in 1989 by Kate Chivers. Now the combined service works out of Redhill Aerodrome and Marden in Kent – this will soon be relocating back to Rochester.

There are 18 Air Ambulance services in England and Wales – Scotland has its own system. They are not part of the NHS and are funded by donations. In order for the service to function it needs £6.5 million per year and this figure will soon rise to £8million. To cover fuel, equipment and wages it costs £2,500 each time the helicopter takes to the air.

In 2005 Kent, Surrey and Sussex Air Ambulance became the first to carry a doctor as part of the crew – this means that a critical patient can receive invasive and complex care immediately and also during flight to a receiving hospital. They were also the first to establish a HEMS desk in 2006 where ambulance 999 calls can be monitored so that an air ambulance can be deployed immediately should the emergency warrant air ambulance attendance. They were also the first air ambulance to carry whole blood – 4 units of O negative – at the cost of £140 per unit.

The crew of an air ambulance consists of 2 pilots - mostly ex military - a paramedic and a doctor. The doctor is the only member paid by the NHS.

The air ambulances run 24hrs day and night – 98% daytime availability and 85% at night – visibility and weather conditions sometimes making flights impossible. We are very fortunate where we live to have an air ambulance practically on our doorstep but of course the beauty of this amazing service is how quickly they can respond over great distances and are able to deliver care within the ‘Golden Hour’ after an accident. We are very grateful to the crews and all the fundraisers who help keep this vital service running.

is to get on with our lives – not without taking sensible precautions, but certainly not letting ourselves be dominated by fear.

So what are the best precautions? Lock windows and doors and don't leave valuables on show at home or in your vehicles, they advise. Lock your shed – a casual thief will be deterred by layers of security used. Within your shed, why not chain mowers and tools together – the more difficult the treasure is to get hold of, the more likely the thief will look for an easier target to try.

More and more people are installing their own home CCTV systems and dashcams in their car or on their cycle helmets. You could even put a dummy camera up, says Conrad. It may just sow a seed of doubt into the mind of a thief. And he adds that if you are putting cameras up outside your house, don't install them too low as they can be tipped upwards by thieves. A camera out of reach is much more effective.

Both Stuart and Conrad stress the importance of reporting crimes. If we are aware of a crime in progress, or of someone in danger, we should ring 999 for a more prompt response. If the crime is discovered after the event or we have become aware of it second hand, then 101 is the number to dial. Crime can also be reported online by going to: <https://report.police.uk> and following the instructions. Stuart and Conrad see the lists of reported crime and anti-social behaviour in our area and it gives them a picture of what trends may be emerging. But if people don't call it in, they can't know what is going on. It is crucial to report incidents so that the police can respond appropriately.

common knowledge that there simply is insufficient capacity to accommodate existing demand, let alone cope with an increase. The Parish Council and the Flood Action Group will continue to advocate on your behalf with the aim of alleviating the pressure on the system.

The work on the conversion of Centenary Hall continues to programme with the completion of the new furniture and archive store and allocation of storage cabinets to regular users. The new, smaller but commercially fitted kitchen became operational on 9 June and the demolition of the wall between the Outwood meeting room and the original kitchen is now complete and awaiting the installation of the specialist soundproof dividing screen. Decoration and flooring works are in progress and should be complete before the commencement of the final phase of the work to provide an enhanced and enlarged preschool with its own toilet and catering facilities and the enlargement of the Parish Clerk's Office at the end of July.

## **Neighbourhood Watch**

Tandridge Beat officers dealt with a rather distressing report of a particularly aggressive 'Nottingham Knocker' in Park Road, Caterham, at about 11am on Wednesday 6 June. He left the elderly couple in a distressed state and by the time they got around to calling the police, he was well gone!

They have also recently been operating in Burstow. These individuals can be a real nuisance and can cause fear and intimidation.

When they tell you that they are on any type of 'Rehabilitation Scheme', please be assured that this is absolutely untrue. Whatever their story, it's not true: there are no nationally accredited projects anywhere in the UK for 'reformed offenders' that authorises, causes or permits this form of door-to-door selling. It's a scam. They will show you an 'authorisation card' but that's a scam, too – they've made it themselves.

Surrey Police's advice to you is quite unusual in this. If an individual turns up at your door and is polite and goes away when told, the police still want to know that they are operating in your street. So make a 101 call or report it online, just to give Surrey Police the heads up.

Any form of bad behaviour by them which causes you distress, means a 999 call. The police take any form of threatening or intimidating behaviour as a matter to deal with promptly.

As for the unfortunate couple in Park Road, Caterham, the incident number is 45180059462, if you have any information.

This was just one 'scam' discussed at the Tandridge Neighbourhood Watch Seminar which a team of Smallfield Coordinators attended last month. Mark Howell, who is our Crime Prevention Officer, also gave us valuable information regarding other scams:

'Don't give your card details to anyone who cold calls by phone or via the internet saying they are your bank or friend or relative in trouble abroad.'

'If they ask you to call the number they give you, don't – it's fake. Only call the number on your bank card or bank statement. They can also leave the line open and eavesdrop on your conversation with your bank. So phone from a different phone.'

'BT and some other phone service providers offer free equipment, caller ID or barring services. Please call or visit your provider's website for further information.'

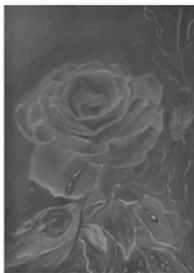

'There are fake DVLA, Passport Office, travel visa, E111 websites. Please double check that you are logged into a .gov website. Some of the scam sites are very realistic.'

There have been several incidents of 'Post box dipping' in the area. Post is stolen from a post box which gives the thief your personal details. They then apply for a Credit Card in your name. They know roughly how long the card and pin number take to arrive, to revisit and collect. They then go on a spending spree using it mainly abroad to purchase expensive goods. The first you will know about it is when you receive the card statement for many thousands of pounds. So please ensure your letter box is secure, that it has a slot too small for a hand or is fitted with an anti-tamper device.

If your road is in one of the Smallfield Neighbourhood Watch schemes your coordinator has access to cold calling and telephone scam stickers. The old blue ones are obsolete. Utility companies also run a password scheme you can subscribe to if you have concerns regarding visits.

If your road is currently not covered by a scheme or you are new to the area please contact me for details of how to set up or join a 'Watch'.

It is also possible to contact Stuart or Conrad direct if you have a concern or something you want to make them aware of – this is part of their role within the community. You can do this by emailing [Conrad.cheeseman@surrey.pnn.police.uk](mailto:Conrad.cheeseman@surrey.pnn.police.uk) or [stuartwren@surrey.pnn.police.uk](mailto:stuartwren@surrey.pnn.police.uk) – but remember, this is not how to report a crime. This should always be to 101 or 999 ensuring that Area Patrol Officers on duty can respond when needed (they are based at Caterham 24/7). The other officers in the Area Patrol or Safer Neighbourhood teams can then also respond in Conrad or Stuart's absence if a more timely response is required

Above all, both PCSOs want to stress that they are here to support the community. "Very often when we are in sight of the public we hear parents threaten their children by saying, 'Be good or the Police will get you or take you away'," says Stuart. "But we're not there to scare children; we aren't bogeymen – we're here to help." And Conrad agrees: "We aim to engage with all parts of the community and as well as reacting to instances of crime, we are happy to speak with anyone about anything."

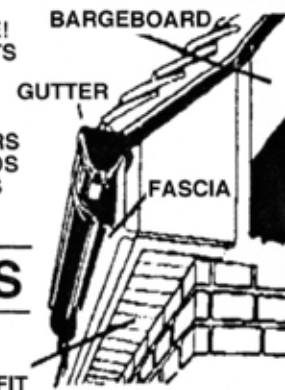
