### RECTOR'S RAMBLINGS

March this year sees the beginning of Lent – 6 March is Ash Wednesday. Lent is a particular time in the year for creating in our daily lives a space for quiet and prayer, reflection and renewal. The 40 days of Lent remind us of Jesus's 40 days in the wilderness and they also remind me of my 40 days in the Sinai desert when I was on sabbatical back in 2014.

When I was planning my sabbatical I first thought of walking from the place of my birth, Stonesfield in Oxfordshire, to Santiago de Compostela in North-West Spain. In the end I decided to go into the desert instead and I know that was the right decision back then. But I think I would one day like to make my walk.

I don't know if you've heard of Santiago de Compostela, but it has been a place of pilgrimage for over a thousand years and people have walked there from all over Europe, finishing at the cathedral and the shrine of St James.

I've always felt an affinity with St James; after all I am named after him. My

second name is James, after St James's Church, Stonesfield where my Dad was the rector. From my childhood I've always remembered a banner of St James hanging in the church, depicting him standing on the top of a mountain, a staff in one hand and a scallop shell in the other. I was pleased to see that it still hangs in the church when I returned for a visit last year as part of my 60th birthday celebrations and looking just now at the picture I took of it then I see the staff is just like the one I took into the Sinai desert with me. It will obviously have to accompany me if I do the walk to Compostela!

The scallop has long been a symbol of the Camino de Santiago, or the Way of St James, as the pilgrimage is called in English. The lines of the shell, starting spread out at the edge and converging at the base of the shell symbolize the different starting points of the pilgrims and their one finishing point. Though there are traditional routes and different starting points ultimately it is said of the Camino that it begins from the front door of your house.

I'd like you to step out with me on the Camino this Lent – but you won't need your walking boots! This year in the Lent Course running in the benefice we will be watching *The Way*, a film about one man's journey on the Camino, the group of people he meets and the way he is changed by his experience and reflecting on our own journey through life. As one review put it: *The Way* is a powerful and inspirational story about family, friends, and the challenges we face while navigating this ever changing and complicated world. As the group make their way across the mountains, defences break down as each of the group comes to realize that life is not so much about changing the things you don't like about yourself. Sometimes it's more about accepting who you really are, and then moving on, content with that knowledge.

If you would like to attend the Lent Course the details of the dates and times follow this letter. And even if you don't attend, you can still try and make a bit of space for yourself in another way during Lent and maybe reflect on the words you've just read: life is not so much about changing the things you don't like about yourself. Sometimes it's more about accepting who you really are, and then moving on, content with that knowledge.

Spring is in the air, crocuses are up and signs of bloom in the daffodils should hopefully see the last of the cold but so far relatively snow-free winter.

The Parish Council, together with considerable support from Tandridge District Council, have continued actively trying to prevent unwelcome intrusion of horse driving on the QEII playing field at the gateway to the village by the erection of post and rail fencing around the whole perimeter. In a way it is a shame to have reduced the open appearance of the area but these preventative measures have been considered necessary to prevent both accidental harm to other users and damage to the surface of the field itself.

**The Annual Parish Meeting, your opportunity to meet parish councillors and learn about and comment on council activities in the past 12 months and future proposals will be held at 7.30pm on Monday 1 April in Centenary Hall, Wheelers Lane. All are welcome.**

With the completion of the refurbishment work on Centenary Hall we are now in a position to commence with the promotion of a 'Community Café', also on 1 April, where people can meet, have a hot drink and socialise. We are installing a snack vending machine courtesy of Scobie Mackintosh, in addition to a bean to cup coffee machine, in the newly formed community room. If someone/anyone wishes to make and sell cakes once or twice a week at this venue please contact the Parish Clerk.

Congratulation to our new litter angels who carried out their initial organised litter pick on Sunday 3 February, amassing over 20 bags of picked rubbish. Their next proposed session will be over the weekend of 6/7 April as Burstow's contribution to The Great British Spring Clean. Please watch the Parish website for further details and the more members that can help in this activity the better the result!

Tandridge District Council has recently received confirmation that Phillip Lewis has been appointed Planning Inspector and will oversee the examination process for the Local Plan. With this progress it becomes even more important for the Parish to have a Neighbourhood Plan in place so that the community is in a position to access CIL funding of up to 25% to help meet infrastructure needs in Burstow. Until the Inspector rules on the soundness of the Plan we won't know if Burstow will be expected to take 300 dwellings (recommended at the moment) or whether this will change.

Finally, starting soon will be a 'short tennis' activity – day and time still to be determined but again, register your interest with the Parish Clerk, Jeannie on 01342 841880. We are still looking for a Pilates Instructor to offer some sessions during the week so if you are, or know of, a qualified instructor ask them to contact us.

Let's all now look forward to a pleasant spring.

Coming from a Methodist background (my father was a Minister) we tried hard not to forget the true purpose of Christmas – to celebrate the birth of Our Lord, Jesus Christ, and to care for each other as we would like to be cared for.

My Christmas traditionally begins when I watch the Carol Service at Kings College Chapel, Cambridge on television. I spent Christmas with my daughter's family but returned home Boxing Day night to my very grumpy cat, who strongly objects to my leaving him.

When you live alone, TV plays a big part of your life, and I have to say I wasn't terribly impressed with the productions available over the holiday period. The real 'funny men' of the past; Morecambe and Wise, the Two Ronnies, and many others have not been followed by many new 'funny men' in my opinion. One of my favourite programs, Countdown, has been corrupted by self-identified comics. However there have been some good travel programmes and wildlife films. I am still pleased to watch Midsomer Murders and Poirot, too.

The New Year started with my, practically traditional, chest infection; though this year because of my recent medical history, it was more worrying than usual. Instead of sitting it out at home I started 2019 with a hospital trip. Now much recovered I look forward to the future and more immediately to Spring and then Summer. I'm not a fan of winter and will be glad to bid it 'au revoir' for a few months.

## SMALLFIELD FLOOD ACTION GROUP

Significant Progress has been made to start resolving the flooding issues across the Parish, including:

- Replacement of a major drain in the centre of Smallfield, adjacent to the School
- Investigations and clearing of road drains and sewers in a number of locations
- Residents working groups undertaking ditch cleaning
- Scavenging of some major watercourses by the Environment Agency
- Installation of a new road drain at a flooding location in Redehall Road
- Extensive investigations to confirm the priorities for future flood improvement works and a major flood alleviation scheme

Ditch Condition Survey of over 30 km of ditches and watercourse undertaken by Surrey CC to develop a programme of ditch maintenance and improvement which will significantly reduce the flooding risks to Smallfield village.

A Community Meeting was held on 15 January to share information about flooding and explain the future plans.

An Awareness Open Day is planned for 7 March. See the Notice with details on the opposite page and come along to learn more and give your views.

## The Winter Home Hub

A new, experimental initiative is running until the end of this month to ensure that we are all safe and well over the final weeks of winter

A partnership between the British Red Cross, Surrey County Council Adult Social Care, First Community and Alliance for Better Care Ltd, the aim is to help anyone requiring support by referring or signposting them to other organisations that can provide the support they need, such as social care colleagues, health care professionals, the voluntary sector and the local practice health champions.

At the end of what may feel to have been a long winter, on-going health problems and feelings of isolation or being alone can make life feel more of a struggle, especially when the weather is colder, and particularly after suffering some sort of setback, whether physical or mental.

So the Winter Home Hub has been set up and will run until the end of March, with the aim of offering more help and advice and assist people who may require some extra support during this period to stay safe and well. People who may be at particular risk might include those who are over 65 (though not excluding those who are younger) and those with a long-term health condition and/or disability.

These surgeries are part of the scheme and ready to receive your calls:

■ **Smallfield Surgery**

Ring 01342 777502 between 10am and 4pm and speak to Suzanne or Tracey

■ **Birchwood Medical Centre**

Ring 01292 7878300 between 10am and 4pm and speak to Beth

■ **Wayside Surgery**

Ring 01293 782-57 between 10am and 4pm and speak to Sarah

You can ring for help yourself, or on behalf of anyone – a neighbour, friend, or family member, but do ask them first whether they would like someone from their GP Surgery to give them a call. Ring the relevant practice and say that you would like extra support from the Home Hub. The receptionist will then refer you/or the person needing support on to the relevant team for the extra help needed. This may be medical in which the surgery staff will help or social, in which perhaps someone from the Red Cross will get in touch.

Do make use of this new scheme – seeking help in good time could avoid a trip to hospital and keep you safe and well.

## BURSTOW AND SMALLFIELD WOMEN'S INSTITUTE

This February Burstow WI was very pleased to welcome Professor Colin Hales to give his talk about Action Medical Research for Children. We had hoped that Colin could give his talk last year but due to unavoidable circumstances he had to cancel but had promised he would visit us in 2019.



Action is a charity based in Horsham which following the ethos of its founder Duncan Guthrie ploughs all of its money into research rather than into advertising and large salaries which means that a lot of people are unaware of the amazing work it does.

In 1949 Duncan Guthrie recognised the need for a Polio vaccine after his daughter had contracted the disease. By 1952 he had set up an independent charity funded by the public to fund research which culminated in the production of an injectable vaccine – and much later the sugar lump droplet. Polio was thus eradicated in the UK.

Thanks to funding from Action over the years vaccines have been developed for rubella (german measles) and meningitis. In the 1960s a project funded by Action found that the addition of folic acid and vitamins to the diet of a pregnant mother would limit the risk of the baby being born with Spina Bifida – in fact incidence of the life-limiting problem was reduced by 70%.

In the 1970s another success for Action funding was Edinburgh University's adaptation of underwater scanning for submarines into a system of ultrasound to monitor the progress of an unborn baby whilst in the womb – something we take for granted nowadays.

In the 80s a project for specially designed seating for disabled children at UCL received help from Action and in the 90s foetal heart monitoring at the University of Nottingham was similarly funded.

The 2000s saw work at UCL on a way to cool an infant suffering from oxygen depletion after a difficult birth. The cooling slows down the metabolism and allows the brain tissue to repair itself thus limiting the chance of damage.

Action-funded research also created a sensor to monitor the heart rate and breathing of an infant during an operation, meaning surgeons did not need to regularly stop the procedure in order to check on the infants vital signs. On-going research is tackling asthma, cerebral palsy, pre eclampsia, cystic fibrosis, Crohn's disease and also infant brain cancer.

Throughout the years over £120 million has been raised for vital research to help children.

The Patron of the charity is the Duke of Edinburgh and amongst many well known ambassadors for Action one that we will all recognise is Paddington Bear. Michael Bond the author met Duncan Guthrie in the 1970s and agreed (with Paddington's consent) to allow the famous bear to be an ambassador.

The members of the WI were amazed at the amount of groundbreaking work that has been funded by Action – they shall be spreading the word and hopefully more donations will roll in.

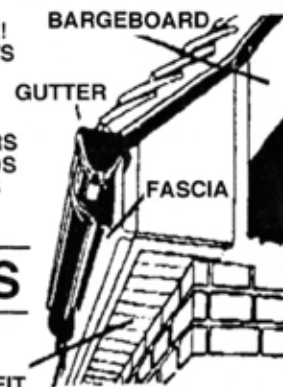
