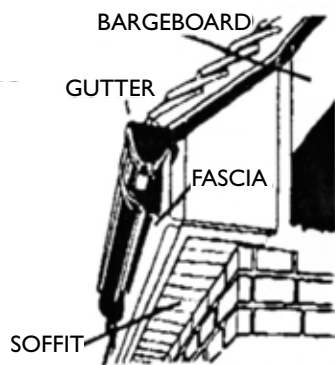

RECTOR'S RAMBLINGS

Have you ever seen a kingfisher? I remember the first time I did, as a young boy walking by the River Evenlode near my home in Oxfordshire. Seeing the flash of electric blue streaking over the water was a magical moment that I still remember. The last time I saw one (and I think maybe the second time) was more recently. Having refreshments at the Langshott Manor Hotel after a funeral, I looked out of the window and there, about three feet away from me, was a kingfisher perched on the balcony eyeing the water below. Another magical moment!

I don't know if you know the poem 'As kingfishers catch fire', by Gerard Manley Hopkins. It begins like this:

*As kingfishers catch fire, dragonflies draw flame;
As tumbled over rim in roundy wells
Stones ring; like each tucked string tells, each hung bell's
Bow swung finds tongue to fling out broad its name;
Each mortal thing does one thing and the same:
Deals out that being indoors each one dwells;
Selves — goes itself; myself it speaks and spells,
Crying What I do is me: for that I came.*

Hopkins is using a variety of images: the beautiful flashes of light created by kingfishers and dragonflies; the distinctive sound that stones thrown into a well make (and if you've ever done that I'm sure you can still hear that sound); the plucked string of a musical instrument and the sound of a swinging bell. Each of these, he is saying, has its own quality and uniqueness. So too, 'each mortal thing', each and every one of us, has within us our own unique voice, our own unique self.

The poem concludes:

*I say more: the just man justices;
Keeps grace: that keeps all his goings graces;
Acts in God's eye what in God's eye he is —
Christ — for Christ plays in ten thousand places,
Lovely in limbs, and lovely in eyes not his
To the Father through the features of men's faces.*

I love that phrase 'Christ plays in ten thousand places'. You might not think of Christ as playing, though you maybe be familiar with the idea of him dancing from Sydney Carter's hymn 'The Lord of the Dance'. But dancing and playing are similar and something that comes naturally to little children. I think when Jesus tells us we need to be like little children in order to see God's kingdom one of the things he is saying is that sometimes we need to lighten up a bit and learn to find beauty and joy in the sights and sounds around us, just as a child naturally does.

And 'Christ plays in ten thousand places' is the thought I'd like to leave with you in this month of May and in this season of Easter that runs through the whole of May this year. *Christ is Risen!* and he plays in ten thousand places. Watch out for him in the beauty of a kingfisher or a dragonfly, a sunrise or a sunset, the sound of birdsong or the face of a loved one. And don't forget to look out for him in yourself and in the own unique note that you bring to the music of the world. You are just as magical as the kingfisher.

HEALTH NEWS

You may be interested to know that since the end of March the NHS 111 and GP out of hours services have changed providers. NHS 111 care in this area was provided by the South East Coast Ambulance Service but this care will now come from Care UK. They are the current providers of the Surrey GP out-of-hours service, and so the aim is that this will mean an integrated urgent care service made up of GP out-of-hours, NHS 111 and a clinical assessment service, making it easier get help from a wider range of healthcare professionals.

The aim is that the redesigned service will meet most healthcare needs on the first call – including a consultation with a doctor, nurse, dentist, pharmacist or mental health specialist if needed. The service should be quicker with fewer questions to answer and you won't be passed from person to person having to repeat yourself each time. As well as offering diagnosis, health advice or next steps, appointments can also be booked with many local services and a wider range of healthcare professionals will on hand to get the answers or advice you need.

If you have an urgent medical problem and you're not sure what to do, you can still ring 111 24 hours a day, seven days a week. Fully trained advisors will ask some simple questions and depending on the situation you will find out what local service can help, be connected to a clinician, get a face-to-face appointment or be told how to get any medicine you need. Remember that NHS 111 does not replace 999 or A&E for medical emergencies when someone is seriously ill or injured and their life is at risk.

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

The Annual Parish meeting took place on 1 April in Centenary Hall though the Parish Council was rather disappointed by the turn out of people wanting to hear about their work. The Chair of Burstow Parish Council is Ian Wates, who has lived in Smallfield since 1966. His work as Chair is supported by ten elected volunteer councillors and a full-time parish clerk. At the meeting, Ian talked about the Council's achievements of the past 12 months and the continuing intentions for the next year. Here is an edited version of his presentation:

Those who regularly visit Centenary Hall will be aware of the change in the building since April 2018, principally funded by the sale of allotment land in the south of the Parish to English Rural Housing Association for the building of ten affordable housing units for those with a local connection with the Parish.

The same floor area has been retained in the meeting hall with the old, unused stage area replaced by improved storage facilities. The kitchen has been completely renewed with commercial equipment, as well as the introduction of a Community Room, improvement of the Parish Clerk's facilities and the separation of the Learn by Play school with its own sanitary and catering facilities. The increase in revenue obtained by these improvements is already evident and extremely encouraging.

We have a very active Flood Action Group, chaired by Graham Pooley, which is working with organisations such as Surrey County Council, The Environment Agency and Thames Water to ensure improvements to our flood protection work is carried out, hopefully preventing a repeat of the flooding in 2013/14. The flood group is reminding residents about their responsibility to keep ditches on their land clear, encouraging residents to report each and every issue with waste water drainage to Thames Water in order to push improvements to our infrastructure to the head of the priority action list and various other tasks including the constant haranguing of Highways England whose motorway construction engineers seem oblivious of the fact that the culverts and pipes they continue to block do, in fact, serve a useful preventative purpose. The Parish Council has made a budget allowance of £3,400 to support this working party

The Burstow Neighbourhood Plan working party, chaired by Peter Bond, is working to produce a Plan that will help direct, amongst other things, what form of development will take place in the Parish. Our initial draft has been submitted to Tandridge District Council and has been returned with constructive comment. There is now a tremendous amount of work to be undertaken to complete the Plan. We are looking for volunteers to help complete this very important piece of work which only really involves a commitment of a couple of hours in sessions

every month or so. This will be a legal document, that once finalised and adopted will provide guidelines to be adhered to by Tandridge District Council Planning department. There are various costs associated with its production and we are approaching the time where we may have to employ consultancy advice. It is estimated that a Neighbourhood Plan costs around £20,000 to produce and although some elements are grant supported, this year we have allowed £5,000 for this in the Parish Council budget.

Work has been under way in the background trying to move forward the project for the formation of a village car park for 60 vehicles on land at the east end of the school playing field in Redehall Road. A planning application was submitted in December 2017, but due to concerns raised by Sport England the application has not yet been determined. We are attempting to resolve the objection raised and are to invite representatives of Sport England to visit the village. We are hopeful of a positive outcome and have built into our budget an allowance to meet the repayments needed for a public works loan.

Principally due to the supportive revenue required for these three important issues and with great reluctance, having maintained the same precept for several years, the Parish Council has increased the parish element of the council tax this year by approximately £5.38 per band D house. This works out at roughly 10p per week per household.

Other volunteer groups work under the umbrella of the Parish Council, benefiting from our admin resources and the public liability cover we can offer to volunteers. Recently we have had a group out washing the road signs to help make your journeys a little easier and hopefully safer. The Litter Angels, also known as Smallfield Wombles, under the capable hands of Katherine and Phil Williams have now been out twice, helping to make our village more litter free.

The CCTV cover has been increased and we now have 12 active cameras in and around the village, offering protection to residents. We believe that due to this installation and the activities of the Neighbourhood Watch scheme headed up by Debbie Hale, the crime figures for the parish have dropped enormously since the very difficult period involving catapults and tyre slashing. Even if your home is not specifically covered by the cameras, the cameras have helped the police to detect and trace suspects. Another added benefit to the local community is the help afforded to victims of road collisions and over the past 12 months we have worked with a number of insurance companies supplying footage to assist with claims.

Although unpopular with some, our SpeedWatch group, headed up by Ashleigh Bolton, remains very active and continues to protect the public with two or three sessions at police approved locations weekly. We do know, from the reduction in the number of offenders recorded, that motorists are now beginning to realise that speeding in our village will no longer be tolerated.

As I'm sure many of you know, there has been some anti-social behaviour on our QEII field in Broadbridge Lane over the past number of months. A youth with a pony and trap has been using the field persistently, causing damage to the playing surface and many residents rightly felt they they were unable use the field whilst he was there with the evident danger of collision with both dog walkers and children. We have worked closely with the Tandridge District Council, who have been extremely supportive, to try to protect the space from such pursuits and estimate that the fencing, ditching and CCTV provision has cost our joint councils somewhere in the region of £20,000. This is money that had to be found within existing budgets as neither authority had set up a contingency for such an unforeseen problem. In addition to these physical measures, Tandridge is currently in the process of having a Public Space Protection Order set in force on the land [*this has been completed since the meeting*]. This PSPO will grant legal protection to the QEII field and also allow the police to have the authority to take action against those who breach the order. So please if you are aware of offences in progress dial 999 and insist on a crime report number.

I am aware of the current concern many of you have as to the lack of a village pub. Although I have had a conversation with the latest lessee I am unable to accurately report on the position moving forward. I can report the Parish Council has successfully applied to have the premises, as well Aurora School registered as an Asset of the Community. It does not give great protection but it does offer some.

I am sure that many of you who are regular motorists will be aware of the increasing dangers of crossing or turning from Plough Road or Wheelers Lane into Redehall. There have been two serious accidents either at or very near to the junction and there is no doubt that there will be more unless some positive action is taken. With this in mind the Parish Council is petitioning Surrey County Council to enforce one way traffic regulation in Wheelers Lane from east to west with the additional introduction of some speed restriction measures west of the car park entrance to Centenary Hall. I am aware that this will inconvenience those of you who live in Wheelers Lane and perhaps also William Gardens but I am sure that if given thought, you will conclude that the advantages strongly outweigh the disadvantages and would ask you to add your name to our petition on the Surrey County Council e-petition webpage.

The Parish Council has recently been made aware of the existence of a Priority Service Register. All utility companies, gas, electricity and water (or at least the larger ones) are required to maintain a Priority Service Register so that vulnerable customers can be protected and looked after in the event of a supply interruption. We have asked UK Power Networks, Sutton & East Surrey Water and Thames Water to send out some literature explaining how you can register and benefit. We are also planning to hold some drop in sessions at Café Nearu later this year.

Presentations were also given at the meeting by Debbie Hale, Neighbourhood Watch; Ashleigh Bolton, Speedwatch; Graham Pooley, Smallfield Flood Action Group; and Peter Bond, Neighbourhood Plan. We shall report on the the activities of all these groups in future issues.

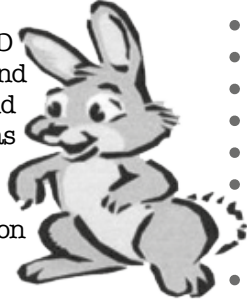
